

Workers' Compensation **Fraud is a Crime**




Punishable by up to 5-Years in Jail and \$150,000 in Fines

Any person who makes or causes to be made any knowingly false or fraudulent material statement or material representation for the purpose of obtaining or denying workers' compensation benefits or payments is guilty of a felony.

Every person who violates subdivision (a) of California Insurance Code Section 1871.4 shall be punished by imprisonment in the county jail for one year, or in the state prison, for two, three or five years, or by a fine not exceeding \$150,000 or double the value of the fraud, whichever is greater, or by both imprisonment and fine.
